

## Our Overnight Camps

CMMBC offers overnight camps for Trailblazers Camp (grades 4-7), and Senior Camp (grades 8-12). Each open-air cabin (boys' cabin pictured below) has 8 bunk beds, and typically houses 6-7 campers with a cabin counselor. The cabin counselor leads campers to ensure that God is honored in all circumstances and to guide them to a maturing relationship with Jesus. In addition, a junior counselor is recommended for Trailblazers Camp.

## Our Day Camps

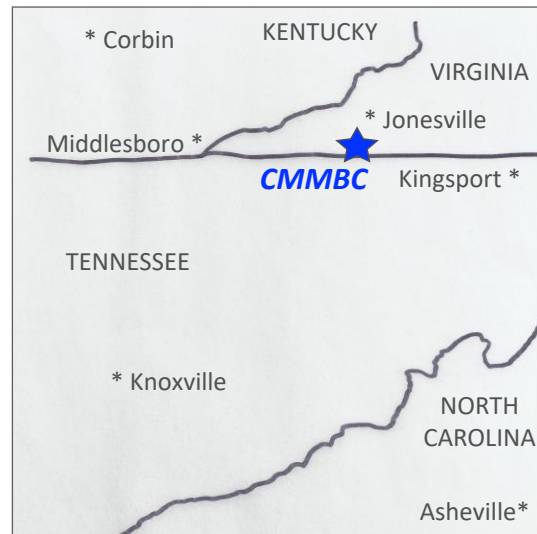

# Sponsoring Camp at CMMBC

## TYPICAL SCHEDULE

Mission Teams typically arrive on the Saturday afternoon or evening before camps start. CMMBC staff, local workers, and the mission team have ~24 hours to become a unified camp staff. Camp schedules and more detailed timelines are provided at our website.

Mission teams depart either the evening after campers leave or early the next morning.

**Pathfinders** are scheduled onsite from 9 AM to 3 PM on Monday - Friday. Camp staff are served breakfast before and supper after the day camp schedule. Lunch and snacks are provided to all during the camp.

**Trailblazers** are scheduled from 9 AM to 7 PM on Monday - Thursday. All meals are provided to campers and staff during the camp schedule.

**Senior Camp** starts on Sunday afternoon with registration from 3-5 PM and closes after the 7 PM chapel service on Friday evening. Activities may be scheduled offsite for one or two afternoons. All meals are provided to campers and staff during the camp schedule.

**Soccer Camp** is scheduled offsite from 6 to 7:30 PM on Monday – Thursday or Friday. Supper is served prior to traveling to Soccer Camp, and a hearty snack is served after Soccer Camp. A light snack is also provided to campers and staff during the camp.

**Arts Camp** is a day camp on Monday –Friday that is offered for various ages as staffing is available, including art, music, and/or theater. Lunch and snacks are provided

**Bicycle Camp** is scheduled offsite as staffing is available.

## Staffing needs

Staffing needs vary by the age group of the camp that is being sponsored. Please contact us or see our website for more details about staffing requirements. Typical roles to be filled include:

- ❖ mission team leader
- ❖ camp speaker
- ❖ lead cook
- ❖ support staff / jr. staff director
- ❖ nurse
- ❖ cabin counselors (at least 1 year post high school graduation)
- ❖ junior cabin counselors (16+ years)
- ❖ craft director
- ❖ music director
- ❖ activities / games director
- ❖ support staff and junior staff (kitchen, games/activities/crafts, music)
- ❖ Prayer Partners (Other Church Members who may not physically be onsite)

Some of the roles can be filled by local volunteers, so please communicate any expected gaps in staffing as soon as possible.

## Developing Teamwork

Please take time to develop relationships among your team members prior to arriving at CMMBC. Identify directors and counselors as soon as possible. We encourage the formation of small groups for Bible study to facilitate the spiritual growth for your team prior to and during their mission trip.

## The cost of hosting camp

Churches that sponsor a week of summer camp need to consider the costs associated with the mission trip. Sponsoring churches are responsible for:

- ❖ their own transportation costs
- ❖ food costs for their own staff (approximately \$15 per day per person)
- ❖ supplies for activities/crafts
- ❖ curriculum
- ❖ cost of t-shirts for staff
- ❖ cost of background checks

Other appreciated support may include:

- ❖ camper t-shirts
- ❖ transportation costs for day camps
- ❖ canteen or craft supplies
- ❖ camper scholarships
- ❖ supplies (trash bags, paper towel, napkins, cleaning agents, etc.)

## Safety

Each sponsoring church is responsible for assuring the safety of their teams. Please have medical information sheets, including allergies and insurance information, for each team member prior to your arrival. Individuals under age 18 must also have parental consent forms, and those over 18 must complete volunteer applications (including background check). Most churches have existing processes and forms in place, but do not hesitate to contact us if you need example forms. In addition, emergency procedures will be provided onsite.
